

## Dive The Raja Ampat Archipelago

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On A Trip To The Best Diving  
On The Planet!

January 23 - February 3, 2007

Join the staff of On-the-Edge Magazine for an exciting adventure to one of the best dive locations in the world. On board the luxury schooner, Seven Seas, escape to this remote archipelago.

Raja Ampat island group off the "Bird's Head" of West Papua has more than 1,500 islands and lies in the heart of the Coral Triangle. It supports the richest tropical coral reef biodiversity recorded anywhere in the world.

The archipelago encompasses nearly 20,000 square miles of largely intact reefs, seagrass beds, mangroves, and rocky coastline. With a low resident human population and minimal industrial development, the Government of Indonesia is working to protect Raja Ampat as a World Heritage Site.

We depart Bali on January 23rd and fly to Sorong where this 10-day adventure begins. The cost of the trip is \$2,950 USD and includes diving, food, domestic air and port fees. International travel can be arranged by Uncommon Adventures, a travel expert for this part of the world.

The Raja Ampat area hosts great mangrove forests and unexplored bays that you can visit with the Seven Seas small fleet of kayaks, and there is an endless supply of picture-book deserted beaches!

An afternoon cruise with one of the tenders gets you up-close-and-personal with the overwhelming landscape and often allows for spotting of the elusive Bird of Paradise from the water. For more serious explorations into the rainforest, the Seven Seas team works with local guides who can help you on your search for mysterious birds and plants.
